**The Canadian Model of Occupational Performance and ...**  
The COPM is an individualized, client-centred outcome measure. The Canadian Occupational Performance Measure is an evidence-based outcome measure designed to capture a client's self-perception of performance in everyday living, over time. Originally published in 1991, it is used in over 40 countries and has been translated into more than 35 languages.

**Cognitive Orientation to Daily Occupational Performance ...**  
The Kawa Model (2006) was created by a team of occupational therapists in Japan led by a Japanese-Canadian occupational therapy scholar to enable occupational therapists everywhere to "just ask the client how they want to live their lives so that it is more meaningful to them, and look together with them what they can do to achieve that." (Teoh 2010)

**About - The Kawa Model**  
There are numerous mathematical models, some simple and some more complex, that can be used to adjust the TLV for chemical exposure to a different work schedule. ACGIH indicates that the Brief and Scala model is easier to use. This model reduces the TLV by a factor that considers the hours worked daily and the periods of rest between them.
