The recommended duration of

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antimicrobial treatment for patients with CAP is a minimum of 5 days.

Pharmacists should work actively with physicians to recommend appropriate antimicrobial therapy for the treatment of patients with CAP and are in a key position to ensure that patients receive the appropriate duration of therapy.

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and treatment of CAP in adults. The guidelines are more narrow in scope than previous versions, and focus primarily on the care of a patient with active pneumonia. Cultures have long held a prominent role in diagnosing infectious diseases.

Updated CAP Guidelines - Pharmacy Times

For hospitalized adults with nonsevere CAP who do not have risk factors for *P. aeruginosa* or MRSA, the guideline recommends empiric treatment with a beta-lactam plus a macrolide or with a respiratory fluoroquinolone. For patients who have documented allergies or contraindications to both macrolides and fluoroquinolones, a third option is combination therapy with a beta-lactam and doxycycline.

The guideline makes recommendations in response to key decisions facing

Practice guidelines are systematically developed statements to assist practitioners and patients in making decisions about appropriate health care for specific clinical circumstances. Attributes of good guidelines include validity, reliability, reproducibility, clinical applicability, clinical flexibility, clarity, multidisciplinary process, review of evidence, and documentation.

Practice Guidelines - IDSA

Antibiotic recommendations for hospitalized patients with CAP are divided by the site of care (medical ward or intensive care unit [ICU]). Most hospitalized patients are initially treated with an intravenous (IV) regimen but can

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transition to oral therapy as they improve. (See 'Route of administration' below and 'Switching to oral therapy' below.)

The guidelines will likely also provide updates on appropriate empiric antibiotic selection, as several antibiotics have been approved for the treatment of CAP since the publication of the previous guidelines. In clinical trials, ceftaroline showed superior clinical outcomes compared to ceftriaxone in CAP caused by *S pneumoniae* and MSSA. 11 For inpatients with *P aeruginosa* risk factors, the previous guidelines recommended double gram-negative coverage, but the new guideline recommends 1 antipseudomonal β -lactam.
